What we're looking for

We are looking for two Melbourne based performers - see full details of the skills and experience we're looking for on page 3.

We welcome applications from anywhere in Australia; however, you must be based in Melbourne for the duration of rehearsals and the tour.

By the start of the tour (16th February), you must:

- be over 21 and
- hold a full driver's license (no L or P plates) otherwise we can't insure you on the vehicle and therefore can't cast you.
- hold a current employment Working With Children Check, or equivalent. Without this you can't work in schools and therefore we can't cast you.

A note on casting:

The creative team is committed to diversity and inclusion. We strongly encourage submissions from actors from First Nations, culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds, neurodiverse actors, with disability and/or who identify as LGBTQIA+.

Suitable candidates will then be invited to an audition. We will send you a link to a short monologue and two short tracks for you to prepare. You may also be invited to a one-hour group audition on the same day where we will explore characters and your creativity.

From those auditions we will create a shortlist. Those shortlisted will be invited to an interview via Zoom.

Production dates:

(Note: both sets of dates will vary slightly dependent upon bookings.)

Term 1 tour (2.5 weeks rehearsal, plus 6 weeks touring):

- Rehearsals: Wednesday 28th Jan to Friday 13th February
- The tour will commence on **Monday 16**th **February**
- The tour is currently due to conclude **Friday 27**th **March** but may be extended through to Thursday 2nd April if we get additional bookings
- Please note you will be required to be away from home for four weeks of the tour

Term 2 tour (2 days rehearsal, plus 7.5 weeks touring):

- Rehearsals: Monday 4th & Tuesday 5th May
- The tour will commence on Wednesday 6th May
- The tour will conclude on Friday 28th June
- Please note you will be required to be away from home for the first four weeks of the tour

Job payment

Paid - The tour and rehearsals are paid at Live Performance Award rates plus overtime, relevant travel allowances, annual leave and Super. This equates to approx. \$1,600 per week before tax, plus Super.

We provide a company vehicle and, when you are away from home, accommodation is arranged and paid for by us.

The work

Rehearsals are full time during the day Mon to Fri, 9am to 6pm.

Most of the tour will be away from home so you must be comfortable with several weeks of travelling.

You will learn three shows, both of which are plays with songs lasting 40-45 minutes plus a structured and scripted Question & Answer session with the students. (We will teach you how to lead the Q&A.) Our focus is on wellbeing and literacy programs.

You will learn three shows, some of which are adaptations of children's books or stories. Our focus is on wellbeing and literacy programs:

 - Bully Bull Ring is designed to impart onto the students the same wisdom the animals give to Bellamy. Each of the animals teaches Bellamy how to use her emotional intelligence. Key topics include building respect, resilience & confidence

 - Students will watch and learn as our two high energy performers take them on a guided tour through some of the world's most famous fairy tales, each told through the lens of a different style of puppetry.

All three shows are plays with songs lasting 40-45 minutes plus a structured and scripted Q&A with the students. Scripts and songs will be supplied before the end of the year (as soon as contracts are signed).

Please note, if you are successful there is the opportunity for work on future tours. We have many actors who stay with us for multiple tours.

Performer requirements:

The role requires a performer with the ability to play with voice and physicality to portray numerous characters in the same show and who has a good instinct for comedy. All characters are varied so capability for clearly drawn differences in physicality and voice or accent is critical.

We require a confident singer; the role would suit either a trained musical theatre performer or an actor who can sing. Also, ability to follow basic choreography / movement.

We use puppetry in our shows so experience in puppetry or dance would be an advantage; but don't worry, we have an amazing puppetry teacher!

It is also advantageous if you have a genuine interest in working with children, e.g. performing, teaching, etc. and experience of working in school environments.

You will be required to drive a large car (e.g. (Kia Carnival) and bump in and out of schools, therefore you need to be physically capable.
